ABOUT THE SEMINAR

West Bengal is the abode of numerous tribes who reside in the various parts of the State ranging from hill, forest and coastal areas. They largely rely up on the resources of nature to fulfill their daily needs. Good health is a prerequisite for human wellbeing and prosperity. Again, for the tribals, who depend mostly on manual labour for economic subsistence, it is the only means which has a direct bearing on their survival. Traditionally the tribal people mainly have faith on medicinal plants for their health care. They have a vast knowledge about the medicinal plants, which are available in their locality. Furthermore many of them also have critical knowledge on folk methods of treatment to cure several cases like fracture of bone, controlof few non-communicable diseases and so on. However, with the advent of modern medicinal systems these knowledge of the traditional health practices are largely diminishing. Therefore, it has now become crucial to preserve this rich repertoire of information. Government of India as well as our State Government runs several programmes for the overall development of the Scheduled Tribes. Issues of health status of tribals and their health care practices are also incorporated in it. Now, time has come to evaluate the situation.
